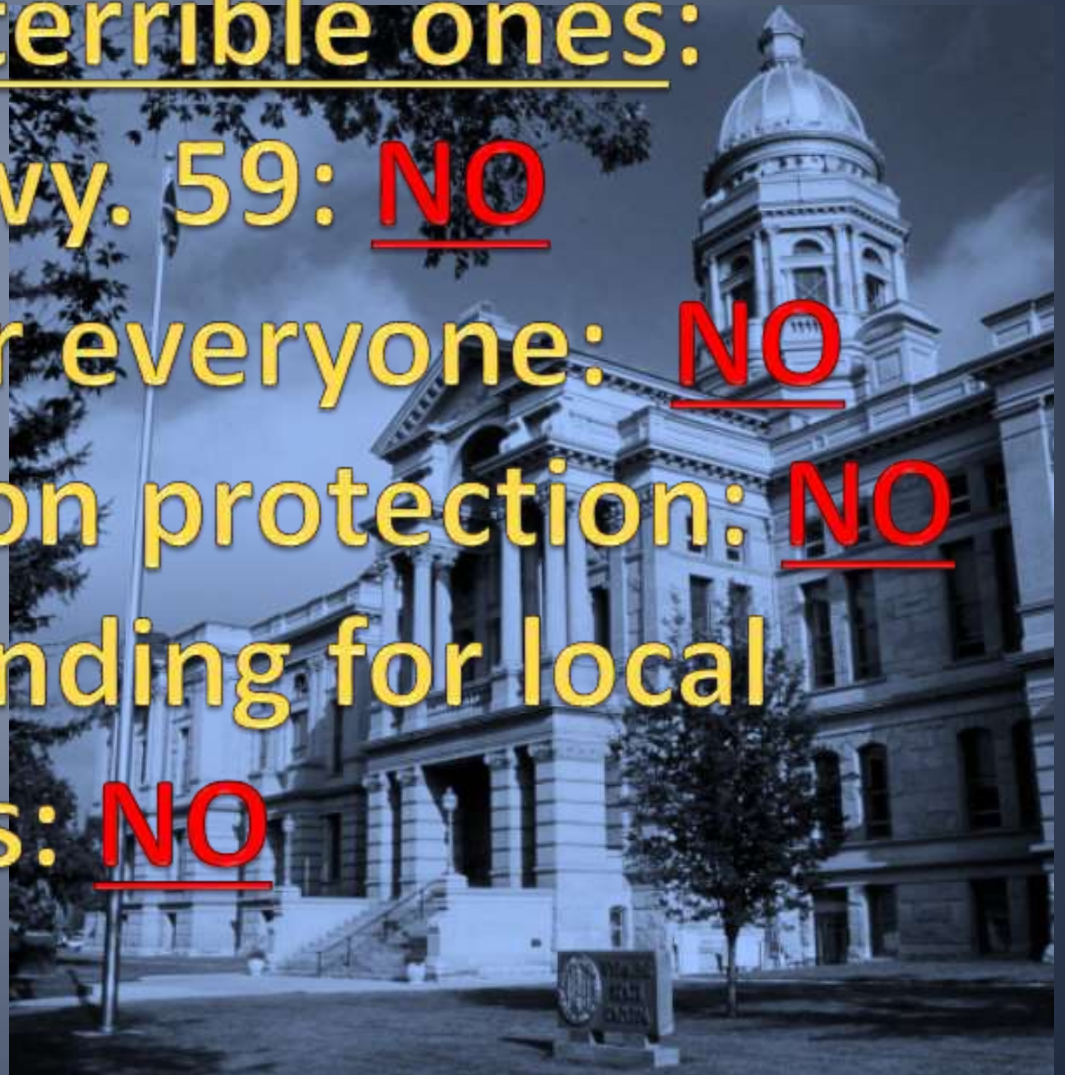

# STEP ONE:

Repeal (or fix) Wyoming  
Constitution Article 16  
Section 6

Is there a prohibition on  
investing in Wyoming?



*Neither the state nor any county, city, township, town, school district, or any other political subdivision, shall loan or give its credit or make donations to or in aid of any individual, association or corporation, except for economic development and necessary support of the poor, nor subscribe to or become the owner of the capital stock of any association or corporation, except ~~that~~ economic development funds, ~~of~~ public employee retirement systems and the permanent funds of the state of Wyoming may be invested in such stock under conditions the legislature prescribes.*



## STEP TWO:

Invest at least 1% of all  
State savings and  
investments in  
Wyoming businesses

development

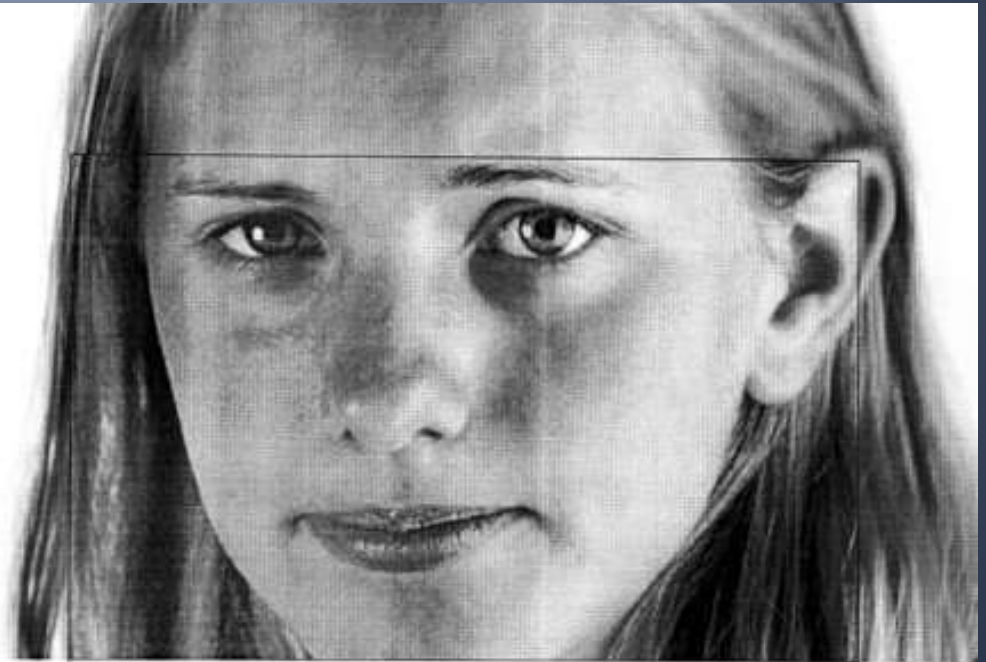
0.5% excise tax in
